GUIDING US TOWARDS RESILIENT AND SUSTAINABLE GRASSLANDS AND HUMAN COMMUNITIES

OBJECTIVES & OVERVIEW

The first summit in 2020 focused on defining the Roadmap's vision and defining high level priorities that elevated grasslands across the 3 countries and 8 sectors. The executive summary produced during that 2020 virtual summit has been guiding conversations and actions in the interim. Working groups have been working on policy, communications, metrics and biological and science tools that are needed to help save our grassland landscapes and human communities. The newest edition of the Roadmap, published in April 2022, is a culmination of this work, and provides a collaborative framework for the 2022 Summit.

The 2022 Summit is designed to meaningfully engage participants, encourage interaction, increase trust and collaborative will, and build shared understanding through story circles, roundtable conversations, and diverse opportunities for networking and dialogue that will propel the collective work forward.

It is time to come together as a diverse community to:

- Receive guidance on the Roadmap's next steps from at least 250 people that represent the 8 sectors and three countries of the Central Grasslands Roadmap
- Solidify and celebrate leaders' and delegates' current and future contributions to reaching the Central Grassland Roadmap's vision, goals, and strategies
- Participate in cross-sector discussions to learn from one another and find areas of collaboration and overlap
- Collectively identify and prioritize immediate action steps to implement the Roadmap in the next 1 – 3 years and make measurable changes toward our collaborative scorecard
- Affirm steering committee leaders to steward the Roadmap for the coming years

Room #322 – Goal 1: Human Dimensions Goal [Interpretation offered during Session 5 only] Each year, First Nations/Indigenous land stewards, ejidos, and family ranchers across the biome report the ability to sustain their connection to the land and their working operations, as well as report that they have sufficient access to financial and technical assistance resources that fit their land management and stewardship decisions.

Room #304/306 – Goal 2: Landscape Conservation Goal [Interpretation offered during Session 5 only] By 2032, ensure that hundreds of millions of acres/hectares of grass are improved, restored, or kept intact for conservation to the benefit of nature and people across the biome from Mexico to Canada.

Ballroom B – Goal 3: Species Goal [Interpretation Offered during Session 6 only] By 2032, wildlife populations will be stabilizing, stabilized, or remain stable, relative to current trends, understood through a chosen suite of species representing birds, insects, and mammals. This goal will be held in Ballroom B and immediately broken into three sub-goal sections: 3a – Insects, 3b – Birds, and 3c - Mammals

Room #308 – Goal 4: Water Goal [Interpretation Offered during Session 7 only]

By 2032, water extractions from aroundwater and surface water sources will be reduced as necessary to sustain dynamically stable groundwater levels, baseflows, and lake/pond levels.

Room #310 – Goal 5: Soil Goal [Interpretation Offered during Session 7 only]

By 2032, multiple stakeholders will collaborate on improving comprehensive soil health to achieve the benefits of increasing resilience to drought, availability of livestock forage and wildlife habitat, and carbon sequestration, sequestering more carbon than is emitted.

Goal 6: Industry, Private Sector and Land Conversion

Food companies, aaribusinesses, supply chain actors and businesses immediately work to increase the positive impacts of agricultural production and stop grassland conversion.

Transportation and energy industry companies of the Roadmap community, immediately work to ensure careful siting of energy, transportation and other commercial/industry development on all projects including wind, solar, oil, gas, coal, and transmission.
